General Objectives:

-To update the training of graduates from the public translators' course so as to complement their undergraduate training, develop skills in interpretation and broaden the professional abilities of those who have graduated from the course of studies many years ago.

- To complete the current undergraduate training, through the incorporation of contents concerning phonology, interpretation, linguistics applied to translation, and new tools and means applied to translation, especially computing resources and access and handling of databases specially developed for translation.

- To foster the composition of a research area, as a central strategy for the development and curricular update of the undergraduate course in Public Translation.

Specific objectives: The course seeks graduates to:

- Analyze and acquire basic concepts that will allow them to understand how linguistic knowledge works.
- Be acquainted with the ordinary and alternative theoretical and methodological approaches to translation and interpretation.
- Get started in the linguistic research applied to translation
- Reflect upon their professional practice and revise it through the incorporation of new theoretical paradigms.

To design and apply research projects to different areas of the business area. For graduates to work as specialists in company and business law advice, in interdisciplinary working teams.

To transfer the results of interdisciplinary training to university teaching.

Module 14: Preventive tendering. Outstanding aspects in tendering procedures. Preventive tendering: requirements and effects.

Module 15: Tendering and creditors. Verification of loans and different admission systems to tender liabilities. Analysis of institutions regulated in tendering laws which tend to an adequate protection of credits.

Module 16: Group tendering. Tendering in associations. Legal provisions, requirements and presentation.

Module 17: Accounting aspects of tendering and negotiation techniques. Accounting aspects of tendering, assets and liabilities state, balance sheets, accountants' judgments, and documentation required for tendering presentation. Introduction to negotiating techniques.

2. Extraordinary courses.

First and second modules: methodology of scientific research.

Methodology of scientific research will be approached in two stages. So as to enable students to face the elaboration of thesis adequately, in these two subjects the core elements of research will be evaluated, namely: a) setting out of problems; b) formulation of hypothesis; c) description of the theoretical frame; d) test design; e) data gathering; f) data analysis and interpretation; g) conclusions.

Objectives

The course is aimed –from an interdisciplinary approach- at training human resources who will be able to acknowledge that every regulation has a bearing on the economic system and that, consequently, they must be analyzed from the point of view of the system's efficiency as well as of the possible covered inequities that they may contain. The undesired and unintended effects of the regulations will be analyzed in a bid to contribute to the creation of more efficient law.

To foster the importance of the fact that high civil servants, judges and attorneys should understand that the efficiency of economic theories is not to be undermined. Every decision-making individual, political or legal, needs to be informed of the consequences their decisions on society. The analysis of law and economy also permits attorneys to understand the impact of legal regulations on the commercial and patrimonial situation of clients, which allows them to provide better advice. In particular in areas where there is an active administrative regulation in which both economists and attorneys participate, the analysis of economy and law will allow for the understanding of mutual positions, leading to a stricter legislation without inconsistencies regarding their objectives.
