Second term: 17) Cognitive psychology and cognitive therapies: Foundations of cognitive therapy; Rorschach test: a cognitive approach. 18) learning and cognition: development and numeric learning in early childhood. Optional subject: 19) Cognition and disorders. Cognitive models in the explanation of the depression syndrome; OCD, anxiety disorders and eating disorders. Optional subject. 20) Cognitive psychology and marketing. Psychology and marketing: Consumers' behavior. 21) Thesis seminar IV.

Objectives

To carry out, as a main objective, a research on a topic within a specific area of Psychology or on an interdisciplinary topic, which represents an original contribution to knowledge in the area of the specialization chosen. This research will constitute students' Doctorate Thesis and will result from a strictly personal job, carried out under supervision of the Thesis Director.

Applicants admittance

The Doctorate's committee will analyze the applicants' background, hold a personal interview with him and be in charge of an entry examination that will include an evaluation of knowledge and language.

Counselors and Special Course Plans

Counselors will be the intermediary between students and the Committee. Students can choose their counselor from the members of the Teachers staff of the Faculty. Counselors may also be the director or co director of the Thesis.

The plan of special courses must meet the formative needs of students. The Committee will determine the number of credits to be allotted to each course of the specialized course plan. Activities will be organized in such a way that their fulfillment requires not less than one year.

Thesis Director and Plan

The Thesis Director can be a teacher or researcher who possesses the maximum degree or equivalent training. The Thesis plan must include: an explanation of the chosen research topic

and a foundation that accounts for its relevance and originality; a detailed research plan and its corresponding agenda; a specification of the place of work and the means available to carry out the investigation.

Thesis presentation and defense

The Thesis must be original and unprecedented and its title must suit the contents. Once all the requirements have been fulfilled, the Thesis has been completed and with the Director's endorsement, students will present five copies of the Thesis before the Doctorate's Committee to be sent to the members of the Jury. Once the Thesis has been presented, the Committee will propose the appointment of the Jury that will evaluate it. The jury must be made up of three prestigious scientists, if possible, teachers of the University of Buenos Aires, with the maximum degree and renowned antecedents in the area of the Thesis. The jury has a period of sixty days to decide whether the Thesis has the necessary conditions for the oral and public defense or not. In the latter case, they can suggest changes or modifications. The oral defense will be carried out before the members of the Jury. The latter will express their opinion on the quality, originality and relevance of the Thesis. The work can be: a) approved: approved, good, distinguished, outstanding; b) rejected. The decisions of the Jury cannot be appealed.
