

Licentiate in Anthropological Sciences

Licentiate in Anthropological Sciences (Archaeological or Socio-cultural orientation) – 5 years

High School and University / College Teacher of Anthropological Science – 5 years

Objective:

To provide a theoretical and methodological training necessary for responding to the socio-cultural problematic, both through research and professional practice

Contents:

The course of studies is divided into 11 basic subjects and 12 subjects with socio-cultural or archaeological orientation. Students are required to study two modern, one Latin (Italian, French or Portuguese) and one Saxon (English or Dutch) language, so as to be able to have access to texts written in foreign languages.

The degree obtained makes reference to the orientation students have chosen: socio-cultural or archaeological. In order to get the degree students must pass all the subjects as well as the seminars included in the syllabus and the Thesis.

In order to obtain the Teaching Degree, students are to take two pedagogic subjects instead of doing the Thesis and attending the Research Seminar.

Job Opportunities

Licentiatees in Anthropological Sciences are qualified to:

- Carry out research and analysis on the socio-cultural reality in order to develop or improve theoretical and methodological models
- Plan, develop and evaluate projects - together with social and institutional groups in addition to organizations- within the frame of socio-cultural policies.
- Promote and give advice and orientation on the organized participation of groups, associations and intermediate institutions in their search of solutions for socio-cultural problems, respecting and re-valuating their cultural regulations.
- Organize, administer, run and supervise institutions that work in the areas of socio-cultural planning and development.
- Provide assistance to different levels of decision-making entities through diagnosis, analysis and socio-cultural reports setting priorities and providing alternatives.
- Conduct censuses and develop registers of fields, collections, and elements of archaeological nature in national, private or official areas.
- Foster and stimulate the creation and preservation of museums and official institutes and to project and restore fields and archaeological monuments.
- Design, run, coordinate, develop, supervise and evaluate programs of urgent rescue of archaeological fields.
- Evaluate works that may directly or eventually jeopardize the preservation of archaeological fields.
- Provide advice and carry out analysis and research on the biological vulnerability and the demographic – genetic characteristics of extinct and present human populations and their relationships with socio-cultural phenomena.
- Provide advice on forensic issues concerned with the identification of human remains, and with the research, advice and coordination of anthropometric and ergonomic analysis.
