

## **Philosophy**

### **Licentiate in Philosophy – 5 years**

#### **High School and College/University Teacher of Philosophy – 5 years**

#### **Objective**

To train students who will be able to get integrated to the different areas of the cultural and scientific activities, contributing conceptual strategies that they know, to reflect upon the fundamentals of sciences, arts and political phenomena.

In order to achieve this objective, the course of studies is based upon: the affirmation of the critical nature of philosophic reflection; the emphasis on its relation with its classic and modern roots; the integration of the philosophical activity to the problems affecting the contemporary world and to the disciplines that face them.

#### **Contents**

The syllabus includes basic subjects through which students are trained in the philosophizing practices, the knowledge of important topics and philosophical problems, and the critical knowledge of great philosophers' thoughts. Different orientations are offered: Logics and Epistemology, Metaphysics, Classic Philosophy, Modern Philosophy, Practical Philosophy and Gnosis.

In order to choose on of the orientations students must have passed at least from of the 11 basic compulsory subjects. Students also need to be able to use two foreign languages, one Latin and one Saxon (English or German).

To obtain the Licentiate degree students have to pass the subjects and seminars and write a thesis.

To obtain the Teaching degree, instead of writing a thesis, students need to attend 3 subjects connected to education.

#### **Job Opportunities**

Graduates can work teaching or carrying out research; they can provide advice concerning social, political, cultural and scientific areas.

They can start systematic research projects; carry out coordination and advice tasks in the design of research projects in scientific institutions, research groups and companies; give advice concerning philosophical issues of interest in the areas of social sciences, politics, exact sciences, natural sciences and sciences of communication; make technical revisions of translations of specialised works; give recommendations in the publications of specialised books and magazines; and teach subjects connected to Philosophy in High Schools and Colleges or Universities.
